Setting up your gaming keyboard

- 1. Connect the USB cable (USB-C) to your gaming keyboard and connect the USB cable (USB-A) to the USB port on your computer.
 - Connect the USB cable for accessing all the keyboard functions such as typing, macro, or lighting animation.

2. Steps to download the Alienware Command Center application

- **1.** Go to www.dell.com/support.
- 2. In the Enter a Service Tag, Serial Number, Service Request, Model, or Keyword field, type the model number of your device.
- 3. Select the product from the results to load the product page.
- 4. On the product support page, click **Drivers & downloads**.
- 5. Click Find drivers.
- 6. Select the operating system as Windows 10 or Windows 11 from the **Operating system** drop-down list.
- 7. Choose the category as Application from the Category drop-down list.
- 8. Locate the Alienware Command Center application package.
- 9. Click Download. Turn on your computer.

3. Install Alienware Command Center

Prerequisites

- Download the latest Alienware Command Center application package from www.dell.com/support. See, Download the Alienware Command Center application package.
- Ensure that Microsoft Store updates are turned on before installing Alienware Command Center 5.5 manually.

NOTE: From version 5.5, Alienware Command Center Package Manager is introduced. Alienware Command Center core application, overclocking controls, and peripheral installer packages are installed together using the Alienware Command Center Package Manager. There is no separate package for overclocking profile.

Steps to install

- 1. Browse to the location where you have downloaded the application package file and double-click the file. The **Dell Update Package** window is displayed.
- 2. Click Install. The Alienware Command Center Package Manager window is displayed.
- Click Next >.
 Dell Software License Agreement is displayed.
- 4. Read through the license agreement and select the **l accept the terms in** the license agreement radio button to continue.

5. Click Install.

The installation of the Alienware Command Center application is initiated. Alienware Command Center core application, overclocking controls, and peripheral installer packages are installed automatically through the Alienware Command Center Package Manager.



NOTE: Alienware overclocking control package is only installed on computers that support overclocking, and you must restart the computer to complete the installation.

6. Click Finish.

You can restart now by selecting the check box. Do not select the check box if you prefer to restart the computer later. The Alienware Command Center application is installed successfully.

4. Updating Alienware Command Center from Microsoft Store

If you have an older version of Alienware Command Center, it gets updated automatically to the latest version from Microsoft Store. You must ensure that the Microsoft Store update is turned on. If there is an update, when you launch the Alienware Command Center application, a message that states Additional components required is displayed. The additional components are automatically fetched from Microsoft Store. Wait for the installation to complete and restart the computer if required.

NOTE: To enable or disable Microsoft Store updates, click the profile icon at the upper right corner of the Microsoft Store page, and go to App settings. Use the App updates toggle switch under App settings to enable or disable Microsoft Store updates.

5. Launch the Alienware Command Center application on your computer

You can launch the Alienware Command Center application from the Start menu. If you have an Alienware Command Center desktop icon, you can also launch the application by double-clicking or tapping the icon.

Installing AWCC through Windows Update

- 1. Navigate to the program folder to ensure that the AWCC installation is complete.
- **2.** Launch AWCC and perform the following steps to download the additional software components:
 - In the Settings window, click Windows Update, and then click Check for updates to check the Alienware driver update progress.
 - If the driver update is not responding in your computer, install AWCC from the Dell Support website.

Installing AWCC from the Dell Support website

There are two versions of AWCC: 5.X and 6.X. AWCC 6.X is available for Alienware computers launched from the year of 2022 onward and third-party systems while AWCC 5.X is for all other computers.

- 1. Download the latest version of the following applications at **www.dell.com**/ **support/drivers**.
- 2. Navigate to the folder where you saved the setup files.
- **3.** Double-click the setup file and follow the on-screen instructions to install the application.



Using Alienware Command Center

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Keyboard basic color function

- 1. Launch Alienware Command Center application from the start menu.
- 2. Select FX and edit Lighting.
- 3. Select Effect from the drop-down list.
- 4. Define the effect of the keyboard LEDs.
- 5. Adjust the brightness.

Update firmware and restore factory defaults



- 1. Select Effect from the dropdown list for Static or On Key Press modes.
- 2. Select Standard key groupings.
- 3. From the menu of supported animations: Color, Pulse, Breathing, Morph, Spectrum, Single Color Wave, Scanner, Rainbow Wave, and Static Default Blue.
- 4. Adjust the tempo of the animation effect.
- 5. Choose color using the color wheel bubble.
- **6.** Define the color of the keyboard animation effect.
- 7. Adjust the brightness.



Create and Assign Macro

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- 1. Click **FX** menu and select **Macro** tab, then choose the AW420K keyboard device.
- 2. Keystroke, Macro, Shortcut, Text block can be created and assigned to any key on the keyboard
- **3.** Allowed to save the themes/presets (lighting, macros) created in AWCC, to the device onboard memory profiles



Update firmware and restore factory defaults



- 1. Click **FX** menu and select **Settings** tab, then choose the AW420K keyboard device.
- 2. Click **Update** to view the firmware version and check if any new firmware is available. Or you can click **Restore Factory Defaults** button to reset the device to the manufacturing state.

Using Alienware Command Center 6.X

- 1. Click on the Alienware Tenkeyless Gaming Keyboard image in the DASHBOARD to go to ALIENFX.
- 2. Under ALIENFX PRESET in SYSTEM, you may perform the following functions:
 - a. LIGHTING: Configure Lighting of the keyboard.
 - b. KEY BINDS: Re-assign the function of keys.
 - c. SETTING: Configure the device settings.
- **3.** Save Preset to Device To save the themes/presets (lighting, macros) created in AWCC, to the device onboard memory profiles.
- **4. Button Remapping** Ability to reassign the essential functions of most keys. Also includes ability to click directly on the keyboard key to create macros.

Setting up Lighting and Animation

Alienware Tenkeyless Gaming Keyboard allows the user to change the Lighting effect of the through AWCC and store it in the device.



- 1. Click AlienFX icon.
- 2. Under ALIENFX PRESET in SYSTEM, select LIGHTING from the Top Right menu bar.
- 3. Select Effect from the drop-down list for STATIC (ALWAYS ON) or ON KEY PRESS modes.
- 4. For STATIC (ALWAYS ON), select the section of the keys or all sections that you want to apply the animation above the keyboard image.

Setting up Lighting and Animation

5. From the menu of supported animations, select one of the following:

Off, Color, Pulse, Morph, Breathing, Spectrum, Single Color Wave, Rainbow Wave, Scanner, Static Default Blue

- 6. For Color animation, define the color of the keyboard animation effect by:
 - a. Choose color using the color wheel bubble or enter the RGB value of the desired color or select from the **PRESET COLORS**
 - b. Adjust the brightness.
 - c. Adjust the tempo of the animation effect.
- 7. For **Rainbow Wave** animation, you can select the direction of the lighting effect and the tempo:

Left to Right, Right to Left, Bottom to Top, Top to Bottom

8. For ON KEY PRESS modes, from the menu of supported animations select one of the following options:

Off, Pulse, Morph, Breathing, Spectrum, Reactive, Single Color Rain Drops, Rainbow Rain Drops, Arrows, Fireworks, Single Color Wave, Rainbow Wave, Scanner, X-Ray

Create and Assign Key bind

Key bind is a feature for the user to re-assign the original function of any keys except.

Key bind Creation:

Key binds can be assigned in two ways. One is to create key binds first and then drag & drop into the specific key. Second way is to click directly on the keyboard key in AWCC to create & assign macros in one go.

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Create and Assign Key bind

- 1. Click AlienFX icon.
- 2. Under ALIENFX PRESET in SYSTEM, select KEY BINDS from the Top Right menu bar.
- **3.** Click on the **CREATE NEW MACRO** or Select any key to create a new key bind of the following types and map the key bind to any key
 - a. **REMAPPING** Button Remapping can be done by selecting any key on the keyboard in AWCC. Remapping cannot be done by using Create new Macro Option .
 - b. KEYSTROKE select a key stroke by pressing a key on the keyboard.
 - c. MACRO record a series of key stokes.
 - NOTE: KEYSTROKE and MACRO key binds can repeat the key stroke once, repeat by toggling the key stroke, repeat the keystroke while the key is pressed or to repeat the key stroke for several times
 - d. SHORTCUT launch a program file, launch a folder, a computer or an internet address.
 - e. TEXTBLOCK record a block of text.
- **4.** User can Right click on the key to edit / delete assigned Key bind to the keys.
- 5. User may click on the **RESET ALL KEYS** button to clear all the key bind assignment.

Keybind Assignment



- 1. Click AlienFX icon.
- 2. Under ALIENFX PRESET in SYSTEM, select KEY BINDS from the Top Right menu bar.
- **3.** Drag an existing Keybind from the **ALL KEYBINDS** or **MY KEYBINDS** folder and drop it on any of the keys . There is a predefined keybind that cannot be customized:
 - a. Disable Key disable the function of a key.

Save Preset To Device

Alienware Tenkeyless Gaming Keyboard allows the user to save the themes/ presets (lighting, macros) created in AWCC, to the device onboard memory profiles. Users can switch the profiles by using Fn+F3 in the device.



SETTING

You may update the firmware of the keyboard when a new version is available. In addition, you may also reset the keyboard setting to its factory default on a single click.



Update firmware and restore factory defaults:

- 1. Click AlienFX icon.
- 2. Under ALIENFX PRESET in SYSTEM, select SETTING from the Top Right menu bar then Update.
- 3. View the firmware version and check if any new firmware is -available.
- **4.** Click **Restore Factory Defaults** button to reset the device to the manufacturing state.

NOTE: Reset Factory Defaults feature will reset all the keyboard settings and configurations to the factory defaults then AWCC will apply the existing Lighting and Macro settings to the keyboard when it is connected to the system

Disabling the modified keys temporarily

Query	Solution
Working behavior of modified keys	When a key is programmed with macro, it will continue to send macro commands during normal usage.
Disabling the modified keys	Press Fn + any key (except Function keys).
	Example:
	Q key was programmed to "ABCD" and in order for Q key to output "Q", press $Fn + Q$.
Using modified keys	Password entry for log in.

Connect the keyboard to another USB port. Restart the computer. Adjust keyboard brightness via AWCC (Alienware Command Center).
The selected configuration is not working in Alienware Command Center	 Ensure that the Alienware Command Center is running on your computer. Open the Alienware Command Center and ensure that the configuration for your gaming keyboard is set properly and is stored by clicking on the SAVE THEME.
