**WARNING:** If the door or door seals are damaged, the microwave oven must not be operated until it has been repaired by a trained person.

**WARNING:** It is hazardous for anyone other than a trained person to carry out any service or repair operation, which involves the removal of any cover, which gives protection against exposure to microwave energy.

**WARNING:** Liquids or other food must not be heated in sealed containers since they are liable to explode.

01. Only use utensils that are suitable for use in microwave ovens.

02. Metallic containers for food and beverages are not allowed during microwave cooking.

**Microwave mode:**

Use only heat-resistant materials such as ceramic, glass, or plastic.

**Grill or grill combination mode:**

Use heat-resistant ceramic or

glass, and the grill rack.

03. When heating food in plastic or paper containers, keep an eye on the microwave oven due to the possibility of ignition.

04. The microwave oven is intended for heating food and beverages. Drying of food or clothing and heating of warming pads, slippers, sponges, damp cloth and similar may lead to risk of injury, ignition or fire.

10. Pay attention not to displace the turntable when removing containers from the appliance.

11. The appliance shall not be cleaned with a steam cleaner.

## 2. GETTING TO KNOW YOUR MICROWAVE OVEN

### 1) Door lock

Microwave oven door must be properly closed in order to operate.

### 2) Viewing window

Allow users to monitor the cooking status.

### 3) Rotating ring

The glass turntable sits on its wheels; it supports the turntable and helps it to balance when rotating.

### 4) Rotating axis

The glass turntable sits on the axis; the motor underneath it drives the turntable to rotate.

### 5) Turntable

The food sits on the turntable, its rotation during operation helps to cook food evenly.

### ⚠ CAUTION

- Place the rotating ring first
- Fit the turntable onto the rotating axis and

make sure that it is geared in properly.

### 6) Control panel

- Microwave button
- Defrost/Clock button
- Menu button
- Grill button
- Eco/Mute button
- Auto clean button
- Stop/Lock button
- Start/+30s button

### 7) Grill rack

Used to place the food for roasting.

### 8) Waveguide cover

It is inside the microwave oven, next to the wall of the control panel.

### ⚠ WARNING

Never remove the waveguide cover.

## 3. BEFORE FIRST USE

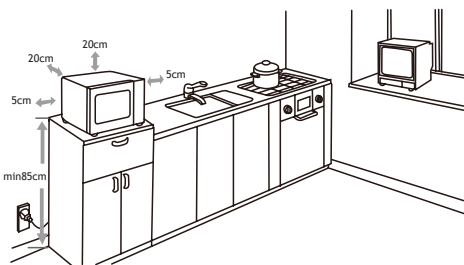
1. Remove all packing materials. If there is a safe film over the microwave oven, tear it off before use. Check carefully for damage. If any, immediately notify dealer or send to the manufacturer's service center.

2. Microwave oven must be placed under dry and non-corrosiveness environments, kept away from heat and humidity, such as gas burner or water tank.

3. Place the appliance on a stable, horizontal level and heat-resistant surface to ensure sufficient ventilation. The distance of the back of microwave oven to the wall should be at least 20 cm, the side to the wall should be at least 5 cm, the free distance above the top surface at least 20 cm. The height of the microwave oven to the ground should be at least 85 cm.

4. The position of the microwave oven shall be such that it is far from the TV, Radio or antenna as picture disturbance or noise may occur. The distance should be more than 5m.

5. The appliance must be positioned so that the plug is accessible, and must ensure a good grounding in case of leakage, ground loop can be formed to avoid electric shock.



6. The microwave oven must be operated with the door closed.

7. The microwave oven must not be placed in a cabinet. The microwave oven is intended to be used freestanding.



8. As there is manufacturing residue or oil remained on the microwave oven cavity or heat element, it usually would smell the odor, even a slight smoke. It is normal and would not occur after several times use. Keep the door or window open to ensure good ventilation. It is strongly recommended to place a cup of water in the cavity and setting at high power and operate for several times before of first usage.

## 4. USING YOUR MICROWAVE OVEN

### 1. BEFORE COOKING

The display lights up when plugged into the power supply, then enters the standby state and display shows 1:00.



### 2. MICROWAVE FUNCTION

Press the “” button and select the desired microwave power. Turn the knob to increase or decrease the cooking time: the selectable time range is from 0:10 to 60:00. After selecting the time, press the “” button to start working. A buzzing sound will notify when the operation has been completed.

There are five microwave power levels, 800W, 640W, 400W, 240W and 80W, respectively.

HIGH	800W	Applicable for quick and thorough cooking
M.High	640W	Applicable for medium express cooking
Med	400W	Applicable for steaming food

### ⚠ CAUTION

- The max time which can be set is 60 minutes.
- Never use the grill rack during microwave cooking.
- Never operate the microwave oven empty.
- At the maximum microwave power, the microwave oven will automatically reduce the power after 9 mins to lengthen the service life.
- If you need to turn the food during operation, open the door, turn the food, and place it back. Then press the “” button once and the preset cooking procedure will continue.
- If you intend to remove the food before the preset time, you must press “” button once to cancel the preset procedure.

### OPERATION

- Connect the cord
  - Do not block the ventilation.

- Place the food on the glass turntable tray and close the door.

- Food must be contained in an utensil.
- Do not operate the microwave oven without load, otherwise it will cause damage to the microwave oven.

- Select the desired microwave power level.


- The microwave oven starts running. If pausing in midway is needed, just open the door at any time, and close it to resume operation.

- When it times out and cooking ends, the microwave oven produces a bell ring, the inside lamp will also be automatically turned off.

- It is recommended to wear gloves when removing the cooked food from microwave oven and be careful. Do not touch the innerwall of cavity.

### 3. DEFROST AND CLOCK


#### 3.1 DEFROST

There are two defrost modes, dEF1 and dEF2, respectively. dEF1 is for defrost by weight and dEF2 is for defrost by time. Press this button once to select defrost by weight or twice to select defrost by time, and the display screen will display “dEF1” or “dEF2”. Turn the knob to select food weight or defrost time. The optional weight range of dEF1 is from 100g to 1500g, and the optional time range of dEF2 is from 0:10 to 60:00. After selecting the defrost by weight or time, press the “” button to start the defrosting process. A buzzing sound will notify when the operation has been completed. In the dEF1 defrost mode (by weight), the microwave oven will beep halfway through the cycle to prompt you to turn the food over.


### ⚠ CAUTION


- It is necessary to turn over the food during operation to obtain uniform cooking.
- Defrosting usually requires more time than cooking the food.
- If the food can be cut with a knife, the defrosting process can be considered completed.
- Defrosted food should be consumed as soon as possible. It is not recommended to put it back in the fridge or freeze it again.

#### 3.2 CLOCK (24-hour clock)


In standby mode, press and hold the “” button for more than 3 seconds to


enter the clock setting interface. The display screen blinks in hours and there will be the beeping sound. The hour time can be set by turning the knob.

After setting the hour, press the “.30” button for a short time to confirm and switch to the setting minute mode. The display screen blinks in minutes. The minutes can be set by turning the knob.

After setting minutes, press the “.30” button again to confirm and the microwave oven will exit the clock setting mode automatically.

#### 4. AUTO COOKING

There are 20 automatic menus A.1-A.20, potato, pasta, pizza, popcorn, vegetable, beverage, meat, fish, reheat, bread, soup, butter (melt), grilled chicken, grilled steak, grilled chicken wings, roasted potato, roasted bacon, sausage, skewers and grilled salmon respectively. Press the “” button continuously to select the desired menu, the display screen shows A.1-A.20.

Turn the knob to select the portion size. After selecting the cooking portion size, press “.30” button to start working. A buzzing sound will notify when the operation has been completed.


#### ⚠ CAUTION

a. The temperature of food before cooking should be 20-25°C. Higher or lower

temperatures of the food before cooking would require increasing or decreasing the cooking time.

b. The temperature, weight and shape of food will largely influence the cooking results. If any of the listed factors differ from the menu above, adjust the cooking time accordingly for best results.

## 5. GRILL FUNCTION

There are three Grill modes: G., C-1 and C-2. They are grill, combination 1 of grill and microwave cooking and combination 2 of grill and microwave cooking. Press the “” button continuously, select the desired mode and the display screen will correspondingly display “G.”, “C-1” or “C-2”. Turn the knob to select the cooking time: the time range is from 0:10 to 60:00. After selecting the cooking time, press the “” button to start working. A buzzing sound will notify when the operation has been completed.

G.	In the grill mode, the heating element will be energized during operation time. It is applicable for rolling thin meats or pork, sausage, chicken wing as good brown color can be obtained.
C-1	Combination of grill and microwave cooking which is 30% microwave and 70% grill.
C-2	Combination of grill and microwave cooking which is 55% microwave and 45% grill.

## 6. ECO AND MUTE



### 6.1 ECO

In standby mode, press the button to enter ECO mode, and the display screen will shut down. In ECO mode, press any button to exit ECO mode and the display screen will light up.




### 6.2 MUTE

In standby mode, if the buzzer is sounding, press and hold down this button to turn off the buzzer sound. In standby mode, if the buzzer is silent, press and hold down this button to turn on the buzzer sound.




## 7. AUTO CLEAN

Auto clean is an automatic cleaning function that facilitates users in cleaning the cavity. When in standby mode, press “” button to select the automatic cleaning function, and put 250ml of water (in a vessel) into the cavity. Press “” button to start working. A buzzing sound will notify when the operation has been completed. After the program has finished and the microwave oven has cooled down, wipe the microwave oven with a soft cloth.

## 8. STOP

Anytime during the cooking settings, press “” button to cancel the settings and return to standby state. In the process of microwave oven working, press “” button to pause. Press “” button once again to cancel the function and return to standby state.



## 9. START/+30s


After setting the cooking time or food weight, press the “” button to start the microwave oven immediately. If the microwave oven is in working state, except in the menu mode and weight defrosting mode, press “” button to increase time: each time you press this button, the time increases by 30s. In the menu mode and weight defrosting mode, the time has already been automatically set and cannot be adjusted. In paused state, you can press “” button to continue the cooking mode previously set.

## 10. CHILD LOCK FUNCTION

Use this feature to lock the control panel when cleaning or to prevent children from using the microwave oven unsupervised.

In this mode, all buttons are disabled.

1) Set lock: In standby mode, press and hold the “” button for more than 3 seconds to activate the child lock function. All buttons of the microwave oven cannot be operated except the “” button.

2) Disable lock: In the child lock state, press and hold the “” button for more than 3 seconds to cancel the child lock function. All the buttons of the microwave oven have been restored to normal functionality.

## 5. UTENSILS GUIDELINE

It is mandatory to use the containers which are suitable and safe for microwave cooking. The containers which are made of heat-resistant ceramic, glass or plastic are suitable for microwave cooking. Never use metal containers for microwave cooking and combination cooking as spark is likely to occur. You can take as reference the below table.

## 6. CLEANING & MAINTENANCE

### CLEANING MICROWAVE OVEN CARE

#### ⚠ CAUTION

The microwave oven should be cleaned regularly and any food deposits removed.

#### ⚠ WARNING

a. Unplug and remove the power cord from the wall outlet before cleaning.

Clean the product after it has cooled down. Don't immerse the appliance in water or other fluids when cleaning.

b. Failure to maintain the microwave oven in a clean condition could lead to deterioration of the surface that could adversely affect the life of the appliance and possibly result in a hazardous situation.

c. Never use hard detergent, gasoline, abrasive

powder or metal brush to clean any part of the appliance.

d. Do not remove the waveguide cover.

e. When the microwave oven has been used for a long time, there may be some strange odors in, following 3 methods can get rid of them:

1) Place several lemon slices in a cup, then heat with high micro power for 2-3 mins.

2) Place a cup of black tea in the microwave oven, then heat with high micro power.

3) Put some orange peel in the microwave oven, and then heat them with high micro power for 1 minute.

f. When the product is not used, it should be placed in dry and ventilated area as well as possible.

Rinse with clean water and allow drying thoroughly.

Wash in the dishwasher.

#### Rotation axis:

Wipe clean the surfaces with a dampened soft cloth.

This list summarizes the most common problems you could encounter with the appliance. If you are unable to solve the problem with the information below, you could contact the Candy's Customer Support.

Problem	Possible Cause	Solution
The microwave does not work.	The appliance is not plugged in.	Check if the plug is inserted in the wall socket.
The microwave oven is sparking	Metal products or cooking utensils touching the cavity wall; ceramic products with gold or silver powder edging can also cause spark splashing.	Do not use metal or metal edged cooking utensils.
Stop running during microwave cooking	Thermal fuse causes circuit (magnetron) to open; fan motor does not rotate.	Adjust the door switch or lock hook switch; replace the fan motor.
The light bulb inside the cavity goes out	Loose wire or bulb filament; improper adjustment of the locking hook switch; the first level locking hook switch is damaged.	Tighten the bulb wire or replace the bulb with a new one.

Please check the following before calling for services.

1. Place one cup of water (approx. 150ml) in a glass measure in the microwave oven and close the door securely. Oven lamp should go off if the door is closed properly. Let the microwave oven work for 1 min.

2. Does the lamp light?

3. Does the cooling fan work?

(Put your hand over the rear ventilation openings.)

4. Does the turntable rotate?

(The turntable can rotate clockwise or counter clockwise. This is quite normal.)

5. Is the water inside the oven hot?

If "NO" is the answer to any of the above questions, please check your wall socket and the fuse in your meter box.
