Before you begin

- Save and close all open files and exit all open applications.
- 2 Shut down your computer.

The shut-down instruction varies depending on the operating system installed on your computer.

- Windows 10: Click Start → **U** Power → Shut down.
- Windows 8.1: On the **Start** screen, Click the power icon \bigcirc \rightarrow **Shut down**.
- Windows 7: Click Start → Shut down.
- NOTE: If you are using a different operating system, see the documentation of your operating system for shut-down instructions.
- 3 Disconnect your computer and all attached devices from their electrical outlets.
- 4 Disconnect all attached network devices and peripherals, such as keyboard, mouse, and monitor, from your computer.
- 5 Remove any media card and optical disc from your computer, if applicable.
- Close the display and turn the computer over.

- 2 Connect any external devices, peripherals, or cables you removed before working on your computer.
- 3 Replace any media cards, discs, or any other parts that you removed before working on your computer.
- 4 Connect your computer and all attached devices to their electrical outlets.
- **5** Turn on your computer.


Removing the base cover



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Procedure

- 1 Loosen the five captive screws that secure the base cover to the computer base.
- 2 Using a plastic scribe, gently pry the base cover to release the tabs on the base cover from the slots on the computer base.
- 3 Lift the base cover off the computer base.



4 Using a plastic scribe, disconnect the battery cable from the system board.



Press and hold the power button for five seconds to ground the system board.

Replacing the base cover



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Procedure

- Connect the battery cable to the system board.
- 2 Slide the tabs on the base cover into the slots on the computer base and snap the base cover into place.
- 3 Tighten the five captive screws that secure the base cover to the computer base.

Removing the wireless card



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
Prerequisites

Remove the base cover.

Procedure

- 1 Remove the screw (M2x3) that secures the wireless card and bracket to the computer base.
- 2 Lift the wireless-card bracket off the wireless card.
- 3 Disconnect the antenna cables from the wireless card.

4 Lift and slide the wireless card out of the wireless-card slot.



Replacing the wireless card



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Procedure



CAUTION: To avoid damaging the wireless card, do not place any cables under it.


- 1 Align the notch on the wireless card with the tab on the wireless-card slot.
- 2 Slide the wireless card at an angle into the wireless-card slot.
- 3 Connect the antenna cables to the wireless card.

The following table provides the antenna-cable color scheme for the wireless card supported by your computer.

4 Align the screw hole on the wireless-card bracket with the screw hole on the wireless card and the computer base. 5 Replace the screw (M2x3) that secures the wireless-card bracket to the wireless card and the computer base.

Removing the solid-state drive



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CAUTION: Solid-state drives are fragile. Exercise care when handling the solid-state drive.




CAUTION: To avoid data loss, do not remove the solid-state drive while the computer is in sleep or on state.

Prerequisites

Remove the base cover.

Procedure

Remove the screw (M2x3) that secures the solid-state drive to the computer base. 2 Lift and slide the solid-state drive from the solid-state drive slot.



Replacing the solid-state drive



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
Procedure



NOTE: Adhere the thermal pad on the copper foil area, if the thermal pads are shipped with the solid-state drive.

- 1 Align the notch on the solid-state drive with the tab on the solid-state drive slot and slide the solid-state drive into the solid-state drive slot.
- 2 Press the other end of the solid-state drive to align the screw hole on the solid-state drive with the screw hole on the computer base.

3 Replace the screw (M2x3) that secures the solid-state drive to the computer base.

Removing the memory modules




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Prerequisites

Remove the base cover.

Procedure

1 Using your fingertips, carefully spread apart the securing clips on each end of the memory-module slot until the memory module pops up. 2 Slide and remove the memory module from the memory-module slot.




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Procedure

Align the notch on the memory module with the tab on the memory-module slot and slide the memory module firmly into the slot at an angle.

2 Press the memory module down until it clicks into place.

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Prerequisites

Procedure

- 1 Remove the two screws (M2.5x7) that secure the rear-I/O cover to the palmrest assembly.
- 2 Using a plastic scribe, gently release the tabs that secure rear-I/O cover to the computer base.

3 Slide and remove the rear-I/O cover from the computer base.



Replacing the rear-I/O cover



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Procedure

- 1 Slide the rear-I/O cover into the slots on the computer base and snap the rear-I/O cover into place.
- 2 Replace the two screws (M2.5x7) that secure the rear-I/O cover to the palmrest assembly.

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

- 4 Replace the eleven (M2.5x6) screws that secure the computer base to the palm-rest assembly.

Removing the coin-cell battery



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CAUTION: Removing the coin-cell battery resets the BIOS setup program's settings to default. It is recommended that you note the BIOS setup program's settings before removing the coin-cell battery.



Gently peel off the coin-cell battery along with its cable off the palm-rest assembly.

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Procedure

- 1 Adhere the coin-cell battery to the palm-rest assembly.
- 2 Connect the coin-cell battery cable to the system board.

- 1 Replace the computer base.
- 2 Replace the rear-I/O cover.

Removing the heat-sink assembly



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WARNING: The heat sink may become hot during normal operation. Allow sufficient time for the heat sink to cool before you touch it.



CAUTION: For maximum cooling of the processor, do not touch the heat transfer areas on the heat sink. The oils in your skin can reduce the heat transfer capability of the thermal grease.



- 1 Disconnect the left-fan cable from the system board.

- In sequential order (as indicated on the heat-sink assembly), remove the seven screws (M2x3) that secure the heat-sink assembly to the system board.

4 Lift the heat-sink assembly off the system board.



Replacing the heat-sink assembly



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CAUTION: Incorrect alignment of the heat sink can damage the system board and processor.



NOTE: The original thermal grease can be reused if the original system board and fan are reinstalled together. If either the system board or the fan is replaced, use the thermal pad provided in the kit to ensure that thermal conductivity is achieved.

Procedure

- 1 Align the screw holes on the heat-sink assembly with the screw holes on the system board.
- 2 In sequential order (indicated on the heat-sink assembly), replace the seven screws (M2x3) that secure the heat-sink assembly to the system board.
- 3 Connect the right-fan cable to the respective connector on the system board.
- 4 Connect the left-fan cable to the respective connector on the system board.

- 1 Replace the <u>computer base</u>.
- 2 Replace the <u>rear-I/O cover</u>.
- **3** Replace the <u>solid-state drive</u>.
- 4 Replace the wireless card.
- **5** Replace the <u>base cover</u>.

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





- 3 Replace the five screws (M2x3) that secure the touch-pad bracket to the palm-rest assembly.
- 4 Slide the touch-pad buttons cable into the respective connector on the touch pad and close the latch to secure the cable.
- 5 Slide the touch-pad cables into their respective connectors on the system board and touch pad, and close the latches to secure the cable.

Removing the system board



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- NOTE: Your computer's Service Tag is stored in the system board. You must enter the Service Tag in the BIOS setup program after you replace the system board.
- NOTE: Replacing the system board removes any changes you have made to the BIOS using the BIOS setup program. You must make the appropriate changes again after you replace the system board.
- NOTE: Before disconnecting the cables from the system board, note the location of the connectors so that you can reconnect the cables correctly after you replace the system board.

Boot sequence

This feature allows you to change the sequence of devices that your computer attempts to boot from. If the computer cannot boot from the device you select, it attempts to boot from the next bootable device. You can use this feature to change the:

 Current Boot Sequence — change the boot sequence for the current boot, for example, to boot from the optical drive to run Alienware Diagnostics from the Drivers and Utilities disc or to reinstall your operating system using an external media. The previous boot sequence is restored at the next boot. Future Boot Sequence — change the boot sequence for all future boots, for example, to boot from the primary hard drive.

Boot options



NOTE: The following boot options are available only when the Boot List Option is set to Legacy.

Floppy (Diskette Drive) — The computer attempts to boot from the floppy disk drive. If no operating system is on the drive, the computer generates an error message.

Hard Drive — The computer attempts to boot from the primary hard drive. If no operating system is on the drive, the computer generates an error message.

CD/DVD/CD-RW Drive — The computer attempts to boot from the optical drive. If no disc is in the drive, or if the disc is not bootable, the computer generates an error message.

Network — The computer attempts to boot from the network. If no operating system is found on the network, the computer generates an error message.

- Turn on (or restart) your computer.
- 3 When F2 Setup, F12 Boot Options appear in the lower-right corner of the screen, press F12.



NOTE: If you wait too long and the operating system logo appears, continue to wait until you see the Microsoft Windows desktop. Then, shut down your computer and try again.

The **Boot Options** appears, listing all available boot devices.

4 On the Boot Options, select the device you want to boot from and press Enter.

For example, if you are booting to a USB hard drive, highlight **USB Hard Disk** and press Enter.

- 5 Select the device and press Enter to set the boot priority.
