- Windows 8.1: On the Start screen, click the power icon 0 \rightarrow Shut down
- Windows 7[·] Click Start \rightarrow Shut down



NOTE: If you are using a different operating system, see the documentation of your operating system for shut-down instructions.

- 3 Disconnect your computer and all attached devices from their electrical outlets.
- Disconnect all cables such as telephone cables, network cables, and so 4 on, from your computer.
- 5 Disconnect all attached devices and peripherals, such as keyboard, mouse, monitor, and so on, from your computer.
- 6 Remove any media card and optical disc from your computer, if applicable.
- 7 After the computer is unplugged, press and hold the power button for 5 seconds to ground the system board.



CAUTION: Place the computer on a flat, soft, and clean surface to avoid scratches on the display.

8 Place the computer face down.

Removing the stand

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Easel stand

- 1 Using a plastic scribe, pry the stand cover off the back cover.
- 2 Slide and remove the stand cover from the back cover.



3 Close the stand and remove the screws that secure the stand to the back cover.

4 Slide and remove the stand from the back cover.

Pedestal stand

1 Using a plastic scribe, pry the stand cover off the back cover.



2 Remove the screws that secure the stand bracket to the back cover.

3 Lift the handle and slide it out from the back cover.



Procedure to remove stand riser from stand base

1 Lift the screw handle on the stand base.

2 Using the screw handle, loosen the captive thumbscrew that secures the stand base to the stand riser.

Replacing the stand

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Easel stand

- 1 Insert the tabs on the stand bracket into the slots on the back cover.
- 2 Align the screw holes on the stand with the screw holes on the back cover.
- **3** Replace the screws that secure the stand to the back cover.
- 4 Replace the stand cover.

Pedestal stand

- 1 Insert the tabs on the stand bracket into the slots on the back cover.
- 2 Align the screw holes on the stand with the screw holes on the back cover.
- **3** Replace the screws that secure the stand bracket to the back cover.
- 4 Replace the stand cover.

Procedure to replace stand riser to stand base

- **1** Slide the stand base into the slot on the stand riser.
- 2 Tighten the captive thumbscrew and fold the screw handle on the stand base.

Procedure



CAUTION: Do not remove the computer cover unless you need to install or replace internal components on your computer.

- 1 Using your thumb, press the slot on the back cover.
- 2 Using your fingertips, pry and release the tabs from the back cover.

3 Lift the back cover off the display-assembly base.

Replacing the back cover

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Procedure

Align the tabs on the back cover with the slots on the display-assembly base and snap the back cover into place.



NOTE: Make sure that no cables are caught between the back cover and the display-assembly base.

Replace the stand.

Replacing the optical drive

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Prerequisites

- 1 Remove the stand.
- 2 Remove the <u>back cover</u>.

Procedure

- 1 Disconnect the optical-drive cable from the optical drive.
- 2 Remove the screw that secures the optical-drive bracket to the displayassembly base.

3 Lift the optical-drive bracket from the display-assembly base.

Removing the optical drive

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Procedure

1 Align the screw holes on the optical-drive bracket with the screw holes on the optical drive.



NOTE: You must correctly align the optical-drive bracket to ensure that the optical drive can be properly secured to the computer. For correct orientation, see step 6 in "Removing the optical drive".

- 2 Replace the screws that secure the optical-drive bracket to the optical drive
- 3 Carefully push the optical-drive bezel into the optical drive.
- 4 Place the optical-drive bracket on the display-assembly base.
- 5 Replace the screw that secures the optical-drive bracket to the displayassembly base.
- 6 Connect the optical-drive cable to the optical drive.

Post-requisites

- 1 Replace the back cover.
- 2 Replace the stand.

Removing the hard drive

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CAUTION: Hard drives are fragile. Exercise care when handling the hard drive.

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CAUTION: To avoid data loss, do not remove the hard drive while the computer is in sleep or on state.

Prerequisites

- 1 Remove the stand.
- 2 Remove the <u>back cover</u>.

Procedure

- 1 Disconnect the hard-drive cable from the hard drive.
- 2 Remove the screw that secures the hard-drive assembly to the displayassembly base.
- **3** Slide the hard-drive assembly until the securing tabs are released from the slots on the display-assembly base.

4 Lift the hard-drive assembly off the display-assembly base.



5 Remove the screws that secure the hard-drive bracket to the hard drive.

6 Remove the hard drive from the hard-drive bracket.



Replacing the hard drive

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CAUTION: Hard drives are fragile. Exercise care when handling the hard drive.

Procedure

- 1 Align the screw holes on the hard drive with the screw holes on the harddrive bracket.
- 2 Replace the screws that secure the hard-drive bracket to the hard drive.
- **3** Align the tabs on the hard-drive assembly with the slots on the display-assembly base.
- 4 Slide the securing tabs on the hard-drive assembly into the slots on the display-assembly base.
- **5** Replace the screw that secures the hard-drive assembly to the display-assembly base.
- **6** Connect the hard-drive cable to the hard drive.

Post-requisites

- 1 Replace the <u>back cover</u>.
- 2 Replace the stand.

Removing the memory module

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Prerequisites

- 1 Remove the stand.
- 2 Remove the <u>back cover</u>.
- 3 Remove the system-board shield.

Procedure

1 Using your fingertips, spread apart the securing clips at each end of the memory-module slot until the memory module pops up.

2 Slide and remove the memory module from the memory-module slot.

Replacing the memory module

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Procedure

1 Align the notch on the memory module with the tab on the memory-module slot.

2 Slide the memory module firmly into the slot at an angle and press the memory module down until it clicks into place.



NOTE: If you do not hear the click, remove the memory module and reinstall it.

Removing the wireless card

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Prerequisites

- 1 Remove the stand.
- 2 Remove the <u>back cover</u>.
- 3 Remove the system-board shield.

Procedure

- 1 Remove the screw that secures the wireless-card bracket and the wireless card to the system board.
- 2 Slide the wireless-card bracket off the wireless card.
- **3** Disconnect the antenna cables from the wireless card.

4 Slide the wireless card out of the wireless-card slot.

Replacing the wireless card

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Procedure

- 1 Align the notch on the wireless card with the tab on the wireless-card slot.
- 2 Insert the wireless card into the wireless-card slot.
- **3** Connect the antenna cables to the wireless card.

The following table provides the antenna-cable color scheme for the wireless card supported by your computer:

Connectors on the wireless card	Antenna-cable color
Main (white triangle)	White
Auxiliary (black triangle)	Black

Removing the control-buttons board



Prerequisites

- 1 Remove the stand.
- 2 Remove the back cover.

Procedure

1 Using a plastic scribe, push the securing clips on the control-buttons board slot.



NOTE: Note the orientation of the control-buttons board so that you can replace it correctly.

2 Press the securing clips and lift the control-buttons board off the displayassembly base.

3 Open the latch and disconnect the control-buttons board cable from the control-buttons board.

Replacing the control-buttons board

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Procedure

1 Slide the control-buttons board cable into the connector on the controlbuttons board and close the latch to secure the cable.



- NOTE: You must correctly align the control-buttons board to ensure that it is properly secured to the display-assembly base. For correct orientation, see step 1 in "Removing the control-buttons board".
- 2 Slide the control-buttons board into the slot on the display-assembly base until the securing clips lock in place.

Removing the microphone

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Prerequisites

- 1 Remove the stand.
- 2 Remove the <u>back cover</u>.

Procedure

1 Lift the microphone module off the display-assembly base.

2 Disconnect the microphone cable from the microphone module.

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Procedure

- 1 Connect the microphone cable to the microphone module.
- 2 Slide the microphone module into the slot on the display-assembly base.

Removing the camera

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Prerequisites

NOTE: This chapter is applicable only for systems with a touch screen display. For systems with a non-touch screen display, the microphones will be integrated on the camera assembly.

- 1 Remove the stand.
- 2 Remove the back cover.

Procedure

1 Disconnect the camera cable and antenna cable from the system board.

2 Note the routing of the camera cable and antenna cable and remove it from the routing guides.

Replacing the camera

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Procedure

- **3** Press the camera frame down into the slot on the display-assembly base until it snaps into place.
- **4** Route the camera cable and antenna cable through the routing guides on the display-assembly base.
- **5** Connect the camera cable and antenna cable to the system board.

- 1 Replace the <u>back cover</u>.
- 2 Replace the stand.

Removing the coin-cell battery

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CAUTION: Removing the coin-cell battery resets the BIOS setup program's settings to default. It is recommended that you note the BIOS setup program's settings before removing the coin-cell battery.

Prerequisites

- 1 Remove the <u>stand</u>.
- 2 Remove the <u>back cover</u>.
- 3 Remove the system-board shield.

Procedure

Using a plastic scribe, gently pry the coin-cell battery out of the battery socket on the system board.

Replacing the coin-cell battery

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Procedure

With the positive-side facing up, insert the coin-cell battery into the battery socket and press down the battery into place.

- 1 Replace the <u>system-board shield</u>.

Removing the fan

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Prerequisites

- 1 Remove the stand.
- 2 Remove the <u>back cover</u>.
- 3 Remove the system-board shield.

Procedure

- 1 Disconnect the fan cable from the system board.
- 2 Remove the screws that secure the fan to the display-assembly base.

3 Lift and slide the fan from under the heat sink.

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Procedure

- 1 Slide the fan under the heat sink and place it on the display-assembly base.
- 2 Align the screw holes on the fan with the screw holes on the displayassembly base.
- **3** Replace the screws that secure the fan to the display-assembly base.
- 4 Connect the fan cable to the system board.

- 1 Replace the system-board shield.
- 2 Replace the back cover.
- **3** Replace the <u>stand</u>.

Removing the heat sink

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WARNING: The heat sink may become hot during normal operation. Allow sufficient time for the heat sink to cool before you touch it.

CAUTION: For maximum cooling of the processor, do not touch the heat transfer areas on the heat sink. The oils in your skin can reduce the heat transfer capability of the thermal grease.

Prerequisites

- 1 Remove the stand.
- 2 Remove the <u>back cover</u>.
- **3** Remove the <u>system-board shield</u>.

Procedure

- 1 Remove the screw that secures the heat sink to the display-assembly base.
- 2 In sequential order (as indicated on the heat sink), loosen the captive screws that secure the heat sink to the system board.

3 Lift the heat sink off the system board.

Replacing the heat sink

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CAUTION: Incorrect alignment of the heat sink can damage the system board and processor.

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NOTE: The original thermal grease can be reused if the original system board and heat sink are reinstalled together. If either the system board or the heat sink is replaced, use the thermal pad provided in the kit to ensure that thermal conductivity is achieved.

Procedure

- 1 Align the captive screws on the heat sink with the screw holes on the system board.
- 2 In sequential order (as indicated on the heat sink), tighten the captive screws that secure the heat sink to the system board.
- **3** Replace the screw that secures the heat sink to the display-assembly base.

- 1 Replace the system-board shield.
- 2 Replace the back cover.
- **3** Replace the <u>stand</u>.

Removing the speakers

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Prerequisites

- 1 Remove the stand.
- 2 Remove the <u>back cover</u>.
- 3 Remove the system-board shield.

Procedure

- 1 Disconnect the speaker cable from the system board.
- 2 Note the routing of the speaker cable and the position of the rubber grommets on the computer bezel.
- **3** Remove the speaker cable from the routing guides.
- 4 Remove the screw that secures the tape to the display-assembly base.
- **5** Peel off the tape that secures the speaker cable to the display-assembly base.

6 Lift the speakers, along with the speaker cable, off the display assembly.

Replacing the speakers

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Procedure

- 1 Using the alignment posts and rubber grommets on the display-assembly base, place the speakers on the display-assembly base.
- 2 Route the speaker cable through the routing guides on the displayassembly base.
- **3** Adhere the tape that secures the speaker cable to the display-assembly base.
- 4 Replace the screw that secures the tape to the display-assembly base.
- **5** Connect the speaker cable to the system board.

- 2 Replace the back cover.
- **3** Replace the <u>stand</u>.

Removing the system board

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NOTE: Your computer's Service Tag is stored in the system board. You must enter the Service Tag in the BIOS setup program after you replace the system board.



NOTE: Replacing the system board removes any changes you have made to the BIOS using the BIOS setup program. You must make the appropriate changes again after you replace the system board.



NOTE: Before disconnecting the cables from the system board, note the location of the connectors so that you can reconnect the cables correctly after you replace the system board.

Replacing the display assembly

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Procedure

- **1** Replace the <u>rubber feet</u>.
- 2 Slide the tabs on the display assembly into the slots on the displayassembly base.
- **3** Replace the display-assembly base on the display assembly.
- **4** Replace the screws that secure the display-assembly base to the display assembly.
- **5** Route the optical-drive data cable, touch-board cable, display-backlight cable, hard-drive cables and control-buttons board cable through the routing guides on the display-assembly base.
- 6 Connect the touch-screen board cable and display-panel power cable to their connectors on the display-assembly base.

BIOS setup program

BIOS Overview



CAUTION: Unless you are an expert computer user, do not change the settings in the BIOS setup program. Certain changes can make your computer work incorrectly.



NOTE: Before you change BIOS setup program, it is recommended that you write down the BIOS setup program screen information for future reference

Use BIOS setup program to:

- Get information about the hardware installed in your computer, such as the amount of RAM, the size of the hard drive, and so on.
- Change the system configuration information.
- Set or change a user-selectable option, such as the user password, type of hard drive installed, enabling or disabling base devices, and so on.

Entering BIOS setup program

- 1 Turn on (or restart) your computer.
- 2 During POST, when the DELL logo is displayed, watch for the F2 prompt to appear, and then press F2 immediately.



NOTE: The F2 prompt indicates that the keyboard is initialized. This prompt can appear very quickly, so you must watch for it, and then press F2. If you press F2 before the F2 prompt, this keystroke is lost. If you wait too long and the operating system logo appears, continue to wait until you see the desktop. Then, turn off your computer and try again.

Flashing the BIOS

You may need to flash (update) the BIOS when an update is available or when you replace the system board. To flash the BIOS:

- 1 Turn on your computer.

System diagnostic lights

Power status light: Indicates the power status.

Solid Amber – The computer is unable to boot to the operating system. This indicates that the power supply or another device in the computer is failing.

Blinking Amber – The computer is unable to boot to the operating system. This indicates that the power supply is normal but another device in the computer is failing or not installed properly.



NOTE: See the light patterns to determine the device that is failing.

Off – Computer is in hibernation or turned off.

The power status light blinks amber along with beep codes indicating failures.

For example, the power status light blinks amber two times followed by a pause, and then blinks white three times followed by a pause. This 3,3 pattern continues until the computer is turned off indicating the Recovery image is not found.

Light pattern	Problem description
1	System board: BIOS and ROM failure
2	No memory or RAM detected
3	System board or chipset error
3,3	Recovery image not found
3,4	Recovery image found but invalid
4	Memory or RAM failure
5	CMOS battery failure
6	Video card or chip failure
7	CPU failure
8	LCD failure

The following table shows different light patterns and what they indicate:

The computer may emit a series of beeps during start-up if the errors or problems cannot be displayed. The repetitive beep codes help the user troubleshoot problems with the computer.

Camera status light: Indicates whether the camera is in use.

- Solid white Camera is in use.
- Off Camera is not in use.
