Before you begin

- 1 Save and close all open files and exit all open applications.
- 2 Shut down your computer.

The shut-down instruction varies depending on the operating system installed on your computer.

- Windows 10: Click Start $\rightarrow \bigcirc$ Power \rightarrow Shut down.
- Windows 8.1: On the **Start** screen, click the power icon 0 \rightarrow **Shut down**.
- Windows 7: Click Start \rightarrow Shut down.

NOTE: If you are using a different operating system, see the documentation of your operating system for shut-down instructions.

- **3** Disconnect your computer and all attached devices from their electrical outlets.
- **4** Disconnect all attached network devices and peripherals, such as keyboard, mouse, and monitor from your computer.
- **5** Remove any media card and optical disc from your computer, if applicable.
- 6 After the computer is unplugged, press and hold the power button for 5 seconds to ground the system board.

Removing the USB dongle-bay cover



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Procedure



CAUTION: Place the computer on a flat, soft and clean surface to avoid scratching the display.

- **1** Place the computer face down.
- 2 Press and pull the USB dongle-bay cover.



Replacing the USB dongle-bay cover



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Procedure

Align the tabs on the USB dongle-bay cover into the slots on the back cover and snap the USB dongle-bay cover into place.



Removing the back cover



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Prerequisites

Remove the USB dongle-bay cover.

Procedure (touch screen)

1 Loosen the captive screws that secure the back cover to the inner frame.

2 Slide the back cover towards the top of the computer and lift the back cover off the inner frame.



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Procedure (non-touch screen)

1 Push the stand down.



2 Loosen the captive screws that secure the back cover to the inner frame.

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3 Slide the back cover towards the top of the computer and lift the back cover off the inner frame.



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Replacing the back cover



Procedure

- 1 Align the tabs on the back cover with the slots on the inner frame.
- 2 Slide the back cover towards the bottom of the computer and snap the back cover in place.
- **3** Tighten the captive screws that secure the back cover to the inner frame.

Post-requisites

Replace the <u>USB dongle-bay cover</u>.

Removing the memory modules

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Prerequisites

- 1 Remove the <u>USB dongle-bay cover</u>.
- 2 Remove the <u>back cover</u>.

Procedure

1 Using the tabs pry open the memory-module shield.



- **2** Using your fingertips, spread apart the securing clips at each end of the memory-module slot until the memory module pops up.
- **3** Slide and remove the memory module from the memory-module slot.



Replacing the memory modules

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Procedure

- 1 Align the notch on the memory module with the tab on the memory-module slot.
- 2 Slide the memory module firmly into the slot at an angle and press the memory module down until it clicks into place.



NOTE: If you do not hear the click, remove the memory module and reinstall it.

3 Slide the tabs on the memory-module shield into the slots on the system-board shield and snap it into place.

Post-requisites

- 1 Replace the back cover.
- 2 Replace the USB dongle-bay cover.

Removing the hard drive



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CAUTION: Hard drives are fragile. Exercise care when handling the hard drive.



CAUTION: To avoid data loss, do not remove the hard drive while the computer is in sleep or on state.

Prerequisites

- 1 Remove the <u>USB dongle-bay cover</u>.
- 2 Remove the <u>back cover</u>.

Procedure

1 Press down on the straps on the hard-drive assembly.

2 Using the straps on the hard-drive assembly, gently push and lift the hard-drive assembly out of the hard-drive cage.



3 Pry the hard-drive bracket to release the tabs on the bracket from the slots on the hard drive.

Slide the hard drive off the hard-drive bracket. 4



NOTE: Note the orientation of the hard drive so that you can replace it correctly.



Replacing the hard drive

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CAUTION: Hard drives are fragile. Exercise care when handling the hard drive.

Procedure



NOTE: The hard drive installed on the top slot is the primary hard drive. In case, there is only one hard drive, install it on the top slot.

- 1 Place the hard drive into the hard-drive bracket and align the tabs on the bracket with the slots on the hard drive.
- 2 Snap the hard-drive bracket into the hard drive.
- **3** With the straps facing up, align the hard-drive assembly with the slots on the hard-drive cage.
- **4** Using the straps pull the hard-drive assembly towards the back of the computer till it snaps into the hard-drive interposer.

Post-requisites

- 1 Replace the <u>back cover</u>.
- 2 Replace the <u>USB dongle-bay cover</u>.

Removing the system-board shield

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Prerequisites

- 1 Remove the <u>USB dongle-bay cover</u>.
- 2 Remove the back cover.

Procedure

1 Remove the three screws (M3X4) that secure the system-board shield to the middle frame.
2 Lift the system-board shield off the middle frame.



Replacing the system-board shield



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Procedure

- 1 Align the screw holes on the system-board shield with the screw holes on the middle frame.
- **2** Replace the three screws (M3X4) that secure the system-board shield to the middle frame.

- 1 Replace the <u>back cover</u>.
- 2 Replace the <u>USB dongle-bay cover</u>.

Removing the memory fan



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Prerequisites

- 1 Remove the <u>USB dongle-bay cover</u>.
- 2 Remove the back cover.
- **3** Remove the <u>system-board shield</u>.

Procedure

- 1 Remove the four screws (M2X3) that secure the memory fan to the middle frame.
- 2 Gently lift the memory fan from the system board.

3 Disconnect the memory fan cable from the system board.



Replacing the memory fan



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Procedure

- 1 Connect the memory fan cable to the system board.
- 2 Align the screw holes on the memory fan with the screw holes on the system board.
- **3** Replace the four screws (M2X3) that secure the memory fan to the system board.

- 1 Replace the <u>system-board shield</u>.
- 2 Replace the <u>back cover</u>.
- **3** Replace the <u>USB dongle-bay cover</u>.

Removing the processor heatsink



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CAUTION: For maximum cooling of the processor, do not touch the heat transfer areas on the heat sink. The oils in your skin can reduce the heat transfer capability of the thermal grease.

Prerequisites

- 1 Remove the <u>USB dongle-bay cover</u>.
- 2 Remove the <u>back cover</u>.
- 3 Remove the system-board shield.

Procedure for computers with integrated graphics



NOTE: Depending on the configuration you ordered, the appearance of the processor heat-sink and the number of screws may differ.

- 1 In sequential order (indicated on the heat sink), loosen the captive screws that secure the processor heat-sink to the system board.
- 2 Remove the screw (M3X4) that secures the processor heat-sink fan to the middle frame.

3 Lift the processor heat-sink off the system board.



Procedure for computers with discrete graphics



NOTE: Depending on the configuration you ordered, the appearance of the processor heat-sink and the number of screws may differ.

- 1 In sequential order (indicated on the heat sink), loosen the captive screws that secure the processor heat-sink to the system board.
- 2 Remove the screw (M3X4) that secures the processor heat-sink fan to the middle frame.



Lift the processor heat-sink off the system board. 3

NOTE: Computers that support AMD R9 M470X and AMD R9 M485X graphics configuration are shipped with 8 captive screws





NOTE: Computers that support AMD Radeon Pro WX7100, AMD Radeon Pro WX4150, and AMD Radeon RX470 graphics are shipped with 7 captive screws



Replacing the processor heatsink





CAUTION: For maximum cooling of the processor, do not touch the heat transfer areas on the heat sink. The oils in your skin can reduce the heat transfer capability of the thermal grease.

Procedure

- 1 Align the captive screws on the processor heat-sink with the screw holes on the system board.
- 2 In sequential order (indicated on the processor heat-sink), tighten the captive screws that secure the processor heat-sink to the system board.
- **3** Replace the screw (M3X4) that secures the processor heat-sink fan to the middle frame.

- 1 Replace the <u>system-board shield</u>.
- 2 Replace the <u>back cover</u>.
- **3** Replace the <u>USB dongle-bay cover</u>.

Removing the processor



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Prerequisites

- 1 Remove the <u>USB dongle-bay cover</u>.
- 2 Remove the back cover.
- **3** Remove the <u>system-board shield</u>.
- 4 Remove the processor heat-sink.

Procedure

- 1 Press the release-lever down and then pull it outwards to release it from the securing tab.
- 2 Extend the release-lever completely to open the processor cover.



3 Gently lift the processor and remove it from the processor socket.

Replacing the processor

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CAUTION: If either the processor or the heat sink is replaced, use the thermal grease provided in the kit to ensure that thermal conductivity is achieved.



NOTE: A new processor ships with a thermal pad in the package. In some cases, the processor may ship with the thermal pad attached to it.

Procedure

- 1 Ensure that the release lever on the processor socket is fully extended in the open position.
 - CAUTION: The pin-1 corner of the processor has a triangle that aligns with the triangle on the pin-1 corner on the processor socket. When the processor is properly seated, all four corners are aligned at the same height. If one or more corners of the processor are higher than the others, the processor is not seated properly.
- **2** Align the notches on the processor with the tabs on the processor socket and place the processor in the processor socket.

CAUTION: Ensure that the processor-cover notch is positioned underneath the alignment post.

3 When the processor is fully seated in the socket, close the processor cover.

4 Pivot the release-lever down and place it under the tab on the processor cover.



Post-requisites

- 1 Replace the processor heat-sink.
- 2 Replace the <u>system-board shield</u>.
- **3** Replace the <u>back cover</u>.

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4 Replace the <u>USB dongle-bay cover</u>.

Removing the coin-cell battery

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CAUTION: Removing the coin-cell battery resets the BIOS setup program's settings to default. It is recommended that you note the BIOS setup program's settings before removing the coin-cell battery.

Prerequisites

- 1 Remove the <u>USB dongle-bay cover</u>.
- 2 Remove the <u>back cover</u>.
- **3** Remove the <u>system-board shield</u>.

Procedure

Using a plastic scribe, gently push the tabs on the coin-cell battery socket and lift the coin-cell battery off it's slot on the system board.



Replacing the coin-cell battery



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Procedure

With the positive-side facing up, insert the coin-cell battery into the battery socket and press down the battery into place.

- 1 Replace the <u>system-board shield</u>.
- 2 Replace the <u>back cover</u>.
- **3** Replace the <u>USB dongle-bay cover</u>.

Removing the solid-state drive

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CAUTION: Solid-state drives are fragile. Exercise care when handling the solid-state drive.



CAUTION: To avoid data loss, do not remove the solid-state drive while the computer is in sleep or on state.

Prerequisites

- 1 Remove the <u>USB dongle-bay cover</u>.
- 2 Remove the <u>back cover</u>.
- **3** Remove the <u>system-board shield</u>.

Procedure

1 Open the securing clip that secures the solid-state drive to the system board.

2 Slide and remove the solid-state drive from the solid-state drive slot.

Replacing the solid-state drive

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CAUTION: Solid-state drives are fragile. Exercise care when handling the solid-state drive.

Procedure

- 1 Align the notch on the solid-state drive with the tab on the solid-state drive slot.
- 2 Slide the solid-state drive into the solid-state drive slot.
- **3** Secure the solid-state drive to the system board using the securing clip.

- 1 Replace the <u>system-board shield</u>.
- 2 Replace the <u>back cover</u>.
- **3** Replace the <u>USB dongle-bay cover</u>.

Removing the wireless card



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Prerequisites

- 1 Remove the <u>USB dongle-bay cover</u>.
- 2 Remove the back cover.
- **3** Remove the <u>system-board shield</u>.

Procedure

- 1 Remove the antenna cables from the securing clip.
- **2** Remove the two screws (M2X2.5) that secure the wireless-card shield to the system board.
- **3** Lift the wireless-card shield off the system board.
- **4** Remove the screw (M2X2.5) that secures the wireless-card bracket and the wireless card to the system board.
- 5 Lift the wireless-card bracket off the wireless card.
- 6 Disconnect the antenna cables from the wireless card.

7 Slide and remove the wireless card out of the wireless-card slot.



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Replacing the wireless card



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Procedure



CAUTION: To avoid damaging the wireless card, do not place any cables under it.

- 1 Align the notch on the wireless card with the tab on the wireless-card slot and slide the wireless card into the wireless-card slot.
- 2 Route the antenna cable through the routing guide.
- **3** Connect the antenna cables to the wireless card.

The following table provides the antenna-cable color scheme for the wireless card supported by your computer:

Table 2. : Wirelesscard colour scheme

Connectors on the wireless card	Antenna-cable color
Main (white triangle)	White
Auxiliary (black triangle)	Black

- 4 Press down the other end of the wireless card and align the screw hole on the wireless-card bracket and wireless card with the screw hole on the system board.
- **5** Replace the screw (M2X2.5) that secures the wireless-card bracket and the wireless card to the system board.
- 6 Align the screw holes on the wireless-card shield with the screw holes on the system board.
- 7 Replace the two screws (M2X2.5) that secures the wireless-card shield to system board.



8 Route the antenna cables through the securing clip.



Post-requisites

- 1 Replace the <u>system-board shield</u>.
- 2 Replace the <u>back cover</u>.

3 Replace the <u>USB dongle-bay cover</u>.

Removing the stand



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Prerequisites

- 1 Remove the <u>USB dongle-bay cover</u>.
- 2 Remove the back cover.

Procedure

- NOTE: The process for removing and replacing the stand will be same for articulating stand and pedestal stand.
- 1 Remove the six screws (M4X6) that secure the stand to the middle frame.

2 Lift the stand off the computer.



Replacing the stand



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Procedure

- 1 Align the screw holes on the stand with the screw holes on the middle frame.
- 2 Replace the six screws (M4X6) that secure the stand to the middle frame.

- 1 Replace the <u>back cover</u>.
- 2 Replace the <u>USB dongle-bay cover</u>.

Removing the chassis fan



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Prerequisites

- 1 Remove the <u>USB dongle-bay cover</u>.
- 2 Remove the <u>back cover</u>.
- **3** Remove the <u>stand</u>.
- 4 Remove the <u>system-board shield</u>.

Procedure

1 Remove the power-supply unit cable from the routing guides on the chassis fan.

2 Disconnect the power-supply unit cable from its connector on the system board.



- **3** Disconnect the chassis fan cable from the system board.
- **4** Remove the four screws (M3X4) that secure the chassis fan to the middle frame.

5 Lift the chassis fan along with its cable off the middle frame.



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Replacing the chassis fan



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Procedure

- 1 Align the screw holes on the chassis fan with the screw holes on the middle frame.
- 2 Replace the screws (M3X4) that secure the chassis fan to the middle frame.
- **3** Connect the chassis fan cable to the system board.
- 4 Connect the power-supply unit cable to its connector on the system board.
- **5** Route the power-supply unit cable through the routing guides on the chassis fan.

- 1 Replace the <u>system-board shield</u>.
- 2 Replace the <u>stand</u>.
- **3** Replace the <u>back cover</u>.
- **4** Replace the <u>USB dongle-bay cover</u>.

Removing the power-supply unit



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Prerequisites

- 4 Press the securing clip to release the power-supply fan cable from its connector.

5 Open the securing clips and release the cables.



6 Remove the five screws (M3X4) that secure the power-supply unit to the middle cover.

7 Lift the power-supply unit with the cable off the middle cover.

Removing the inner frame



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Prerequisites

- 1 Remove the <u>USB dongle-bay cover</u>.
- 2 Remove the back cover.
- **3** Remove the <u>stand</u>.

Procedure

1 Remove the screws (M3X4) that secure the inner frame to the middle frame.



NOTE: Touch screen has 14 screws and non-touch screen has 20 screws that secure the inner frame to the middle frame.


2 Gently pry the inner frame from the sides and lift it off the middle frame.



Replacing the inner frame



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Procedure

- 1 Align the screw holes on the inner frame with the screw holes on the middle frame.
- 2 Replace the screws (M3X4) that secure the inner frame to the middle frame.



NOTE: Touch screen has 14 screws and non-touch screen has 20 screws that secure the inner frame to the middle frame.

- 1 Replace the stand.
- 2 Replace the back cover.
- 3 Replace the USB dongle-bay cover.

Replacing the display built-in self test button board

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Procedure

- 1 Place the Display Built-in Self Test button board on the middle frame.
- **2** Align the screw holes on the Display Built-in Self Test button board with the screw holes on the middle frame.

System diagnostic lights

Power status light: Indicates the power status.

Solid Amber – The computer is unable to boot to the operating system. This indicates that the power supply or another device in the computer is failing.

Blinking Amber – The computer is unable to boot to the operating system. This indicates that the power supply is normal but another device in the computer is failing or not installed properly.



NOTE: See the light patterns to determine the device that is failing.

Off - Computer is in hibernation or turned off.

The power status light blinks amber along with beep codes indicating failures.

For example, the power status light blinks amber two times followed by a pause, and then blinks white three times followed by a pause. This 2,3 pattern continues until the computer is turned off indicating the Recovery image is not found.

The following table shows different light patterns and what they indicate:

Light pattern	Problem description
2,1	System board error
2,2	System board or power supply unit or power supply cable error
2,3	System board or memory or CPU error
2,4	Coin-cell battery error
2,5	BIOS failure
2,6	CPU failure
2,7	Memory or RAM failure
3,3	Memory error
3,5	Memory error
3,6	BIOS Recovery Image Not Found
3,7	BIOS Recovery Image Found But Invalid

Table 3. System diagnostic lights
The computer may emit a series of beeps during start-up if the errors or problems cannot be displayed. The repetitive beep codes help the user troubleshoot problems with the computer.

Camera status light: Indicates whether the camera is in use.

- Solid white Camera is in use.
- Off Camera is not in use.
