Product naming for HP printers, MFPs, and scanners



HP LaserJet, PageWide and ScanJet products use a unique alphanumeric code to identify the product's intended market segment, functionality, series, model, and bundle. A similar system is used for HP LaserJet and PageWide supplies.

HP LaserJet and PageWide supplies Selectability Numbers

HP LaserJet and PageWide supplies have a Selectability Number that makes it much easier for customers to identify the correct supplies for their product. Selectability numbers are in addition to HP standard part numbers and do not always correlate (for example Selectability 656X is P/N CF460X).

HP Color LaserJet and PageWide supplies have a three-digit number plus an alpha (A or X, and, in some instances, Y). "A" is used for standard yield cartridges, "X" for high yield, and "Y" for extra high yield. Black, Cyan, Yellow, and Magenta all have the same Selectability Number and are differentiated by packaging colors and descriptions. As of this publication date, HP monochrome LaserJet supplies use a two-digit number plus an alpha (A or X). This will transition to 3-digit Selectability Numbers similar to color supplies.

HP ScanJet Pro and Enterprise products use a similar alphanumeric code as the LaserJet and PageWide devices. Names help to identify the product's intended market segment, functionality, family, bundle, and generation.
