



Getting to know your VivoMini

Features

Front panel



1

Drive activity indicator

This indicator lights up when your VivoMini is accessing the internal storage drive.

Power button

The power button allows you to turn the VivoMini on or off. You can also press the power button once to put your VivoMini to sleep mode.



USB 3.1 Gen 2 ports

This USB 3.1 Gen 2 (Universal Serial Bus 3.1) port provides a maximum of 1.5A output current, transfer rate of up to 10 Gbit/s and is backward compatible to USB 2.0. The ⚡ icon indicates this port's USB Charger+ feature which allows you to quick-charge mobile devices.



Memory card slot

The built-in memory card reader enables your VivoMini to read and write data to and from MMC/SD/SDHC/SDXC cards.

Right panel




Kensington® security slot

The Kensington® security slot allows you to secure your VivoMini using Kensington® compatible security products.

NOTE: The position for this slot may vary per model.

Air vents

The air vents allow warm air to exit your VivoMini chassis.

NOTE: The air vents found on the bottom side of your VivoMini allow cool air to enter your device. It is recommended that you place your VivoMini on a flat stable surface for optimum air ventilation.

IMPORTANT! For optimum heat dissipation and air ventilation, ensure that the air vents are free from obstructions.

Power input (DC 19V)

The supplied power adapter converts AC power to DC power for use with this jack. Power supplied through this jack supplies power to the VivoMini. To prevent damage to the VivoMini, always use the bundled power adapter.

WARNING! The power adapter may become warm to hot when in use. Do not cover the adapter and keep it away from your body.

3 HDMI

HDMI port

The HDMI (High Definition Multimedia Interface) port supports a Full-HD device such as an LCD TV or monitor to allow viewing on a larger external display.

DisplayPort

The DisplayPort sends high-performance digital output from your VivoMini to a display device such as an LCD TV or HD monitor.

USB 3.1 Gen1 port

This USB 3.1 Gen1 (Universal Serial Bus) port provides a transfer rate of up to 5 Gbit/s and is backward compatible to USB 2.0.

6 

LAN port

The 8-pin RJ-45 LAN port supports a standard Ethernet cable for connection to a local network.

7 

Headphone output/microphone input combo jack port

This port allows you to connect your VivoMini to amplified speakers or headphones. You can also use this port to connect your VivoMini to an external microphone.

NOTE: This port does not support three-conductor 3.5mm microphone.


Getting started

Connecting the AC power adapter

To connect the AC power adapter to your VivoMini:

- A. Connect the AC power cord to the AC/DC adapter.
- B. Connect the DC power connector into your VivoMini's power (DC) input port.
- C. Plug the AC power cord into a 100 V~240 V power source.

NOTE: The power adapter may vary in appearance depending on the model or region.



IMPORTANT!

- We strongly recommend that you use only the AC power adapter and cable that came with your VivoMini.
 - We strongly recommend that you use a grounded wall socket while using your VivoMini.
 - The socket outlet must be easily accessible and near your VivoMini.
 - To disconnect your VivoMini from its main power supply, unplug your VivoMini from the power socket.

Connecting a display panel


You can connect a display panel or projector to your VivoMini that has the following connectors:

- DisplayPort connector


To connect a display panel to your VivoMini:

Connect a display cable either to the HDMI or DisplayPort.

Connecting USB keyboard or mouse


You can connect generally any USB keyboard and mouse to your VivoMini. You can also connect a USB dongle for a wireless keyboard and mouse set.

To connect a keyboard and mouse to your VivoMini:

Connect the USB cable from your keyboard and mouse to any of the USB ports of your VivoMini.

Turning on your VivoMini

Press the power button to turn on your VivoMini.



Turning off your VivoMini

If your VivoMini is unresponsive, press and hold the power button for at least four (4) seconds until your VivoMini turns off.

Putting your VivoMini to sleep

To put your VivoMini on Sleep mode, press the Power button once.

Entering the BIOS Setup

BIOS (Basic Input and Output System) stores system hardware settings that are needed for system startup in the VivoMini.

In normal circumstances, the default BIOS settings apply to most conditions to ensure optimal performance. Do not change the default BIOS settings except in the following circumstances:

- An error message appears on the screen during the system bootup and requests you to run the BIOS Setup.
- You have installed a new system component that requires further BIOS settings or update.

WARNING! Inappropriate BIOS settings may result to instability or boot failure. We strongly recommend that you change the BIOS settings only with the help of a trained service personnel.

Quickly enter the BIOS

To quickly enter the BIOS:

- Press the power button for at least four (4) seconds to shut down your VivoMini, then press the power button again to turn your VivoMini back on, then press <F2> or during POST.
- When your VivoMini is off, disconnect the power cord from your VivoMini's power connector. Reconnect the power cable and press the power button to turn on your VivoMini. Press <F2> or during POST.

NOTE: POST (Power-On Self Test) is a series of software controlled diagnostic tests that run when you turn on your PC.

Upgrading your VivoMini

Upgrading memory modules

Your VivoMini comes with two SO-DIMM memory slots that allow you to install two 2 GB, 4 GB, 8 GB, or 16 GB DDR4 SO-DIMMs for a maximum of 32 GB memory.

IMPORTANT!

- It is recommended that you replace the memory modules under professional supervision. Visit an ASUS service center for further assistance.
- Refer to <http://www.asus.com> for the list of compatible DIMMs. You can only install DDR4 SO-DIMMs to the VivoMini's DIMM slots.

WARNING!


- Ensure that your hands are dry before proceeding with the rest of the installation process.
- Before installing memory modules, use a grounded wrist strap or touch a safely grounded object or metal object to avoid damaging them due to static electricity.

To install or upgrade the memory modules:


1. Turn off your VivoMini then disconnect all cables and peripherals.
2. Place the VivoMini on a flat stable surface, with its top side facing down.

- Using a flat-head screwdriver or straightened paper clip, remove the rubber feet from the bottom side and set them aside, then remove the four (4) screws securing the cover.


IMPORTANT! Take note of the orientation of the holed rubber foot on the cover, and the number printed under each rubber foot. These indicate the sequence you must follow when removing the rubber foot from its slot. Refer to the following illustration for details.




4. Get one screw from the ones you previously removed then place it into the hole. Leave a portion of the screw head that would be enough for you to hold.



5. Hold the screw then gently lift the cover slightly from the bottom side of the VivoMini. Use your other free hand to hold the VivoMini in place.




- (optional) If a 2.5" HDD is already installed, remove the HDD cable before removing the bottom cover completely. Lift the flap from the SATA connector (A), then remove the HDD cable from the SATA connector (B).




- Align and insert the memory module into the slot (A) and press it down (B) until it is securely seated in place. Repeat the same steps to install the other memory module.

IMPORTANT! Always install into the lower slot first.




- (optional) If a 2.5" HDD is installed, insert the HDD cable into the SATA connector, then push the flap down to secure the HDD cable.

NOTE: Ensure the HDD cable is seated securely in the SATA connector.




- Remove the screw you previously attached on the bottom cover (A), then align and insert the bottom cover back on your VivoMini (B)



10. Reattach the screws to secure the cover back on the bottom side of the main box, then replace the rubber feet back on each screw hole.

IMPORTANT! Take note of the orientation of the holed rubber foot on the cover, and the number printed under each rubber foot. These indicate the sequence you must follow when replacing the rubber foot back into each slot. Refer to the following illustration for details.




Installing or upgrading the M.2 SSD


Your VivoMini includes an M.2 slot that supports a 2280 or a 2242 M.2 SSD.

To install or upgrade a 2242 M.2 SSD:


1. Follow steps 1-6 under the *Installing or upgrading memory modules* section to remove the bottom cover of your VivoMini.
2. Insert the hexagon screw, as illustrated.



3. Align and insert the 2242 M.2 SSD into its slot inside the VivoMini.




4. Gently push down the 2242 M.2 SSD on top of the screw hole and fasten it using the bundled screw.




5. Follow steps 8-10 under the *Installing or upgrading memory modules* section to replace the bottom cover back on your VivoMini.

To install or upgrade a 2280 M.2 SSD:

1. Follow steps 1-6 under the *Installing or upgrading memory modules* section to remove the bottom cover of your VivoMini.
2. Align and insert the 2280 M.2 SSD into its slot inside the VivoMini.



3. Gently push down the 2280 M.2 SSD on top of the screw hole and fasten it using the bundled screw.



4. Follow steps 8-10 under the *Installing or upgrading memory modules* section to replace the bottom cover back on your VivoMini.


Installing or upgrading the wireless card

Your VivoMini includes an M.2 slot for 2230 wireless and Bluetooth adapters.



To install or upgrade the wireless card:


1. Follow steps 1-6 under the *Installing or upgrading memory modules* section to remove the bottom cover of your VivoMini.
2. Remove the three (3) screws from the USB 3.1 Gen 1 expansion card, then remove it from the chassis.



- (optional) Remove the M.2 SSD if it is installed. Remove the screw securing the M.2 SSD (A), then remove the M.2 SSD from the slot (B) and place it aside.




- Align and insert the wireless card into the lower slot inside the VivoMini (A), then secure it with the bundled screw (B).




5. Connect the black antenna to MAIN or ▲ and the white antenna to AUX or △. Refer to the illustration for the right installation procedure.

NOTE: A soft clicking sound indicates that the antenna has been securely attached on the wireless card.



6. Replace the USB 3.1 Gen 1 expansion card and secure it using the three (3) screws removed previously




7. Follow steps 8-10 under the *Installing or upgrading memory modules* section to to replace the bottom cover back on your VivoMini.


Installing the 2.5" HDD

To install the 2.5" HDD:


1. Follow steps 1-6 under the *Installing or upgrading memory modules* section to remove the bottom cover of your VivoMini.
2. Align the bundled bracket on each side of the HDD and insert four (4) screws to secure the 2.5" HDD to the bracket.



3. Connect the bundled HDD cable to the HDD (A), then secure the HDD and bracket to the bottom cover of your VivoMini using the four (4) bundled screws (B).



4. Remove the tape covering on the HDD cable and stick the cable to the bottom cover of your VivoMini as shown in the illustration below.



7. Follow steps 8-10 under the *Installing or upgrading memory modules* section to replace the bottom cover back on your VivoMini.

Appendix

Safety information

Your VivoMini is designed and tested to meet the latest standards of safety for information technology equipment. However, to ensure your safety, it is important that you read the following safety instructions.

Setting up your system

- Read and follow all instructions in the documentation before you operate your system.
- Do not use this product near water or a heated source.
- Set up the system on a stable surface.
